A Mother's Prayer

Read 2 Timothy 1:3-5

Because my husband was in the military, we moved often. So, I seldom had the opportunity to spend time with my mother as she aged. Over the years, her mind had deteriorated to the point that she barely recognized any of her children or could call us by our names.

A time came when I was able to spend a night with my mother. Shortly after I tucked her into bed, I heard a faint whispering in the room. As I listened closely, my mother prayed for all six of us children and our families. Lifting each of us by name in the order we had been born, she asked God to let us "know Jesus."

For the first time since my conversion about 20 years earlier, I realized that both my salvation and my hunger for God's word were a direct answer to her prayer. I also realized that a prayer doesn't have to be long and wordy to impress God and move God. A short prayer, whispered in faith, has as much power as the longest and most eloquent prayer ever spoken.
