Leave the Rest to God

Genesis 37:1-8

Paul wrote, "Not that I have already . . . been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me." - Philippians 3:12 (NIV)

Let's face it: None of our families is perfect. I've seen some great ones, but even at their very best none of them matches up to the Norman Rockwell images of perfection that my generation inherited from "The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet" or "Father Knows Best."

Fortunately, however, few of our families reach the level of dysfunction we find in Jacob's clan. As if having 12 sons born to two wives and two concubines wasn't complicated enough, add to the family mix Jacob's favoritism toward his best-loved wife, Rachel, and her two sons, Joseph and Benjamin. Mix in a dose of Joseph's arrogance and it's no wonder the other brothers wanted to kill him. That was a family at perhaps its worst.

But even when we are at our best, we will not be able to heal every broken relationship, tie up every loose end and reach some sort of perfection in the relationships in our families, our friendships, in our community, and even in the Body of Christ.

I've heard people say that they want to be like Jesus, expressing perfect, limitless love in difficult relationships. That is, after all, where discipleship leads us. But while God's love is perfect, limitless and unending, ours is not. Our loving will always be limited by our human imperfections. The best we can do is to love the best we can and leave the rest to God's grace.
